The first meeting of the Core Committee for implementing the CBCS in all the Affiliated Colleges as per the structure evolved by the Tamil Nadu State Council for Higher Education (TANSCHE) met at 11.30 A.M. at the Senate Hall, Manonmaniam Sundaranar University Campus on 21.05.08.

The Core Committee had an elaborate discussion on the CBCS and brought out the Common course structure for B.A., B.Sc. Degrees and allocated the number of courses and Credits for Part I, Tamil; Part II, English; Part III, Core Subjects, Allied Subjects and Project/Elective Subjects, Part IV, Non - major Electives, Skill based Education, Environmental Studies and Part V, Extension activities for the B.A and B.Sc. degrees.

The second meeting of the Core Committee on Choice Based Credit System met at 10.30 A.M. at the Senate Hall, Manonmaniam Sundaranar University Campus on 24.05.2008 and evolved the Common Course Structures for BBA, B.Com, B.C.A. and other Job oriented courses and also for the P.G. courses.

- 2. There is a pass minimum of 50% for external and overall components.
- 3. Theory: Internal Assessment = 75:25
- 4. Practical, External: Internal Assessment = 60:40
- For non-practical subjects, practicals shall be replaced by Core/Elective Courses without affecting the Common Course Structure.
- For three year P.G courses like M.C.A., the total credits will be 140. For the V and VI Semesters, the III Semester pattern shall be followed (25+25 = 50 extra Credits for the third year).
- 7. The respective Board of Studies shall decide the Course Structure without affecting the Common Course structure.

Other Recommendations of the Core Committee

1. Internal assessment

- The break for the internal practical marks shall be decided by the respective Board of studies.
 - 6. In Part III there could be one Project and Two Elective Courses or all the three may be Elective Courses (Total 15 Credits)
 - In the case of Value based Education, out of the two hours, one hour may be teaching and one hour may be Field work such as Adult/Women literacy etc.
 - 8. In Part V, Extension activities, NCC, NSS, Red Cross, Youth Welfare etc will be taken into account for one credit. This shall not be included for the percentage of marks.
 - A three-tier grievance redressal mechanism should be evolved involving the Department, the College and the University.
 - Shortage of work load in Allied Subjects shall be compensated with Non-major electives and Skilled based Education subjects.
 - 11. A common Academic calendar informing the reopening day, the closing day and the Examination Time table etc. has to be provided on the reopening day itself.
 - 12. The College shall make available to each student a Bulletin, listing all the courses offered in that semester well in advance.
 - 13. The Performance of the students is indicated by the seven point scale grading system as given below:

- 14. There is a separate passing minimum for the external and the overall components.
- 15. For Non-Major Electives and for Skilled based Education subjects, Orientation Courses shall be conducted for the Teachers at various centres.
