- e-Assignments and printed materials are important measures to improve the studies of students.
- All faculty members are encouraged to generate e-content for various subjects.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Examinations are conducted as per the norms of Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli. The College conducts regular internal assessment tests, Seminars and Assignment during each semester.
- Each semester is divided into three phases consisting of around 30 working days. An Internal Assessment Examination is conducted at the end of each phase. The marks are maintained in the Mark Register as well as entered in the computer.
- Regular periodical tests are conducted during practical classes, and marks are awarded to the performance as a means of continuous internal assessment.
- E-assignment works are allotted to all classes. Seminars are given to the final year students.
- HODs submitted University result analysis to the Governing Board for perusal.
- Remedial classes are conducted for the slow learners.
- Most of our faculty members are appointed as Chief and additional examiners at the University Valuation.
- Giving proper guidance to students to apply for supplementary examination.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

- The College Management provides all basic infrastructural facilities and all resources are made available in the campus for research work.
- The staff members are advised by the Research Committee of the college to pursue projects by getting funds from UGC and other sources.
- The College Management encourages the faculty members to publish their research findings in referred journals and for presenting research papers in conferences and seminars.
- Encouraging the faculty members to pursue research work.
- The Research Committee of the College advises the staff to undertake minor and major projects.

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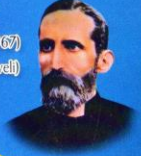

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Dr. A.D.K. Jeyaseelan was the third Principal of our college from April 1995. A.D.Koilpillai computer centre was built in 1996 and P.G.D.C.A course was started in the same year under self-supporting system. B.Sc. Computer Science was introduced in 1997.

The fourth Principal Dr. J. Joel, M.A., M.Phil., Ph.D., assumed charge on 19.2.2000. He was the principal of our college from 2000 to 2013. The college experienced stupendous growth under his leadership. M.Sc., Chemistry Course was started in the year 2001 under self-supporting system. Under self financed category B.Com. and M.Com. courses were introduced during the academic year 2002-2003. The step that was taken by Dr. J. Joel with the active assistance of Prof. Paul Dawson Secretary, NMCP was to complete the remaining construction of the compound wall enclosing the whole area of the college campus. The second floor of the Bishop Jeyapaul David Ladies' Hostel was constructed in 2004. Mr. D. Duraisamy Nadar Block and Mrs. Rajammal Duraisamy Nadar (Oorvasi soaps, Chennai) M.C.A. Block enabled us to start a few courses with ease. Father of Education Mr. Oorvasi D. Selvaraj Computer Research Centre of NMCP helps students to continue a post graduation and research in computer field. Twelve class rooms in the ground floor and an auditorium in the first floor in front of the college chapel bearing the name of our Bishop Dr. J.A.D. JEBACHANDRAN were built.

Bishop Amma Mrs. Visithral Jebachandran Women's hostel with plinth area of 17,000 sq. feet with open air auditorium, indoor basket-ball court (Jesus Redeems indoor Basket-ball Court) a Chapel in first floor named after Bro. D.G.S. Dhinakaran, the prayer warrior and visionary and founder of Jesus calls ministry and spacious, airy ultra-modern rooms, kitchen and toilets were constructed under the UGC XI plan - Special Development Scheme and the new hostel was dedicated and opened on 18 Feb 2012 by Dr. G. Srinivas, Joint Secretary UGC.

The college provides well protected pure drinking water for all the students and staff through RO units.

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#### OUR COLLEGE

Nazareth Margoschis College at Pillaiyanmanai is a Co-educational college of Arts, Science and Commerce. It is named after a well known S.P.G. Missionary Rev. Canon Arthur Margoschis. It is situated in rural surroundings and is easily accessible to the youth of the villages in the southern part of Thoothukudi District. The college is under the management of Thoothukudi - Nazareth Diocesan Trust Association, the educational wing of the Thoothukudi - Nazareth Diocese of the Church of South India.

The college was started in 1967 with three sections in the Pre-University Course affiliated to the Madurai Kamaraj University. Regular classes began from 05-07-1967. Prof. S. James Jagaraj as its first principal guided the destiny of the college for 15 years from 1967 to 1982. It was upgraded to first grade status with the introduction of degree courses in Economics and Mathematics in 1970. It became co-educational in 1972 and in the same year History major was introduced at the degree level.

As Pre-University courses were taken away from colleges in 1979, more degree level courses were started immediately in our college. B.Sc. degree course in Zoology was introduced in 1978. The college started B.A. English Literature degree course in 1979 and B.Sc. Chemistry degree course in 1981.

The second Principal Prof. S. John Gabriel assumed charge as Principal in 1982. He was the Principal of our college from 1982 to 1995. The college chapel was built during his period. B.Com. degree course was introduced in 1982. The college became a Post Graduate Institution from 1987 with the introduction of M.Sc. Mathematics. Advocate Mr. Thangaswamy donated for Maths PG Block.

Front side compound wall was built in his period.

Since 1990, the college has been affiliated to the Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli.

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For the welfare of the staff and students of NMCP the college functions from 8.30 a.m to 1.30 p.m. on all working days. Computer courses and Spoken English classes are being conducted for the 1 year students.

From the year 2014-15 onwards B.A Tamil Literature, B.A English Literature and M.Phil Commerce degree courses were introduced under self supporting system.

Dr. R. Ponthilagar Stanley, Head, Dept. of Economics assumed as Principal in charge from June 2013. Prof. D. Santhi assumed as Principal in charge from October 2014. Dr. Asaithambi Dawson assumed as Bursar from October 2014.

The fifth Principal Dr.H.Ravindran, Head, Dept. of English assumed charge on 20th April 2015.

Due to the prayers, devotions, zeal and tireless service of the Secretary, the Principal, the Bursar and the Staff members, the college is well poised to embark on a programme of growth and development.

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#### COLLEGE RULES

1. Every student should wear a clean and presentable dress or prescribed uniform.
2. On every working day, before the regular classes begin, there will be a morning worship in which all members of staff and students are invited to join.
3. When a member of staff enters the class room the students should rise and remain standing till they are requested to sit or the member of staff takes his/her seat.
4. Students are expected to maintain absolute silence in the class rooms and should not distract or disturb the work of the class or any other class.

10. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of every period.
11. Absence for one period in a session will be treated as absence for that session.

- d) Students should never band themselves together in a body to petition their requests but should individually approach the authority concerned.
- e) Money or subscription of any kind should not be collected by the students from among the students for any reason whatsoever, without the knowledge and permission of the Principal and the Head of the Department concerned.
- f) No political or communal organisation of students may be formed within the college or hostels.
2. No student shall take part in any activities or any public movement, which the college authorities deem undesirable for students to take part in.
3. Every student should handle college property with care and endeavour to preserve the cleanliness and tidiness of the building and furniture.
4. Students are encouraged to avail themselves of bus pass facilities.
5. Smoking within the college or the premises of the residential halls and defacing the walls and such other offences will entail serious punishment.
6. Use of drugs and alcoholic beverages of all kinds is strictly prohibited.
7. No notice or petition of any kind shall be circulated among students.
8. Irregular attendance, insubordination to staff members, habitual inattention to class work, obscenity in word or action and such other conduct considered detrimental to the best interests of the college will be dealt severely.

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9. A highly centralized examination system is followed.
10. Every student should sit for three internal tests and one model exam.
11. Copying in tests and examinations will be viewed very seriously and severe disciplinary action will be taken against those who indulge in such practice.
12. Under the educational rules of the Government, the Principal has full power to inflict the following punishments (Fine, Cancellation of attendance, withholding of term certificate and suspension from the college)
13. According to the instruction of the Director of Collegiate Education No. 1947/R4/2000 dated 08-04-2000, students are not permitted to celebrate the bus farewell day.

#### **WOMEN STUDENTS**

1. Women students should not leave the campus during class hours before 1.30 p.m. However in case of emergency they shall do so after obtaining permission from the Principal through any one of the Students Welfare Officers or the Head of the Department.
2. They should not stay in the retiring hall during class hours under the pretext of sickness. However, if a woman student is indisposed, she should apply for leave and get it countersigned by the H.O.D. or by any one of the Students Counselling Officers.
3. They should wait for the bus, only in the bus stop meant for them.
4. They are strictly not allowed to enter through the main entrance.

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#### **LEAVE AND ATTENDANCE**

1. A student cannot absent himself/ herself from college without submitting leave application.
2. Leave application of non resident students should be countersigned by their parents or guardians and the resident students by the wardens and they must be submitted to the class teacher.
3. All leave applications must be dropped into the box provided for the purpose at the college office.
4. Students coming late to the class will be given admission and attendance at the discretion of the lecturer in charge of the class.
5. Permission will not be granted to go out of their classes for the purpose of meeting friends or under any other pretext.
6. The certificate of attendance required for appearance in the University Examination will in no case be granted unless i) the Principal is satisfied with the student's progress and conduct, and (ii) the student has the required attendance.

#### **PAYMENT OF FEES**

Students must remit their fees within ten working days from the date of reopening in each semester, failing which a fine at the rate of Rupee one per working day will be collected from the date of implementing fine. If a student fails to remit his/her fees with fine within the end of the month, his/her name will be removed from the rolls. Attendance will not be given to him/her for the defaulting days.

If re-admitted, he/she must in addition to the fees and fine due for him, pay a readmission fee. The fine and the

**THE COLLEGE LIBRARY RULES**

1. The library will be kept open on all week days from 8a.m. 4.p.m. The library will be kept closed on Sundays and other notified holidays.
2. All under graduate and postgraduate students will be supplied with three and five Borrower Tickets respectively. For with three borrowing a book, a student must produce the ticket at the issue counter. When he/she returns the book the ticket will be given back to him/her. Students must return their tickets at the end of their course or at the time of leaving the college.
3. The period of loan is ten days only. Three consecutive renewals are allowed provided there is no reservation for that particular book. An over due charge of 25 paise will be levied for each day the book is kept beyond the due date.
4. The Librarian can recall the book at any time without giving reasons.

12. According to the Instructions of the Director of Collegiate Education R Dis. No. 28122/Ms 286 dated 28.1.1967, if a library book is lost, the cost of the book plus 25% of the same will be recovered from the borrower.

**BOOK BANK**

This scheme was introduced under 20 point programme. This collection consists of Text books in multiple copies. This is meant for poor and deserving students only. They can keep the books till they complete their course. Our library has a good collection of such books.

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#### STAFF AND STUDENTS CO-OPERATIVE STORE

There is a staff and students co-operative store. Every member of the college community is eligible for membership, the fee being Rs. 10 for a share for the staff and students. Text books, practical records, stationery items and other articles of daily use are available there.

#### CONDONATION OF ATTENDANCE

1. Those students who have earned attendance of 75% and above can be permitted to appear for the ensuing university examination without any pre-condition.
2. However those students who have earned attendance between 75% and 60% can be permitted to appear for the ensuing university exam by paying Rs. 400/- and with the specific recommendations of the Principal.
3. Those students who have put in less than 60% of attendance should repeat the whole semester after the completion of the course.

#### REVALUATION & RECHECKING OF MARKS

There is provision for revaluation and re-checking of marks in the examinations conducted by the M.S. University.

#### IMPROVEMENT OF MARKS (P.G. COURSE ONLY)

Candidates who wish to improve their performance of marks in the university examination in theory papers/subjects, shall be permitted to re-appear in the succeeding semester examination for the subjects in which they have passed in the first appearance. Improvement of performance of marks is allowed only once for a subject.

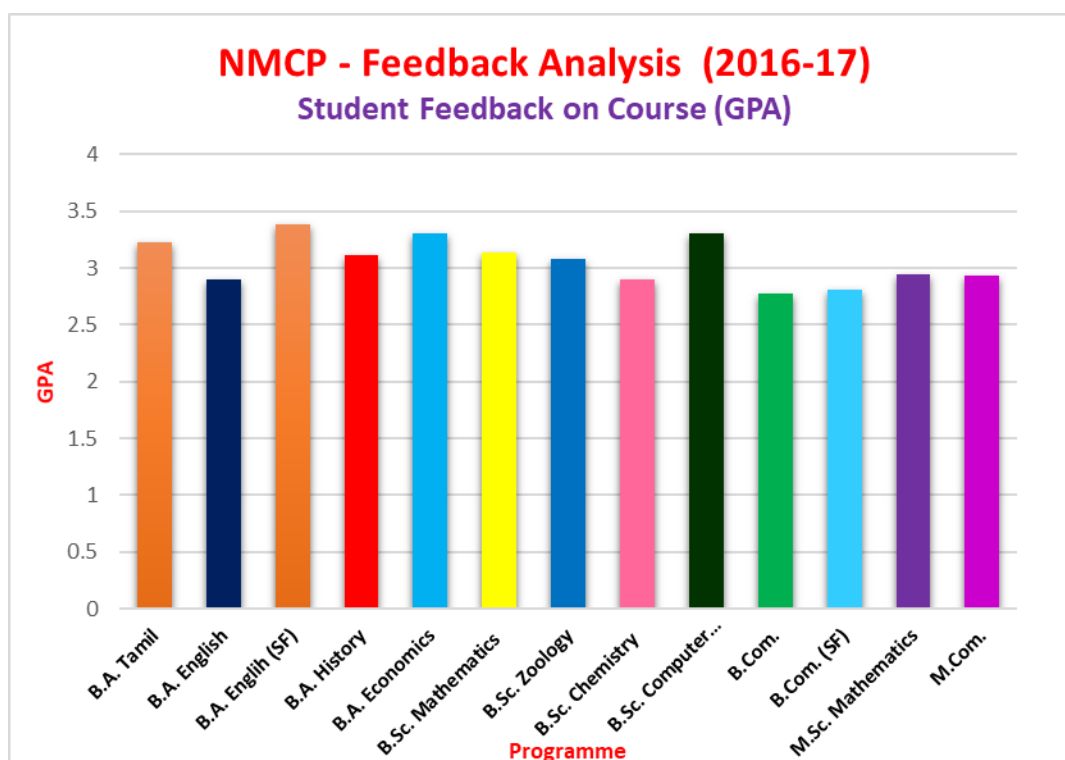

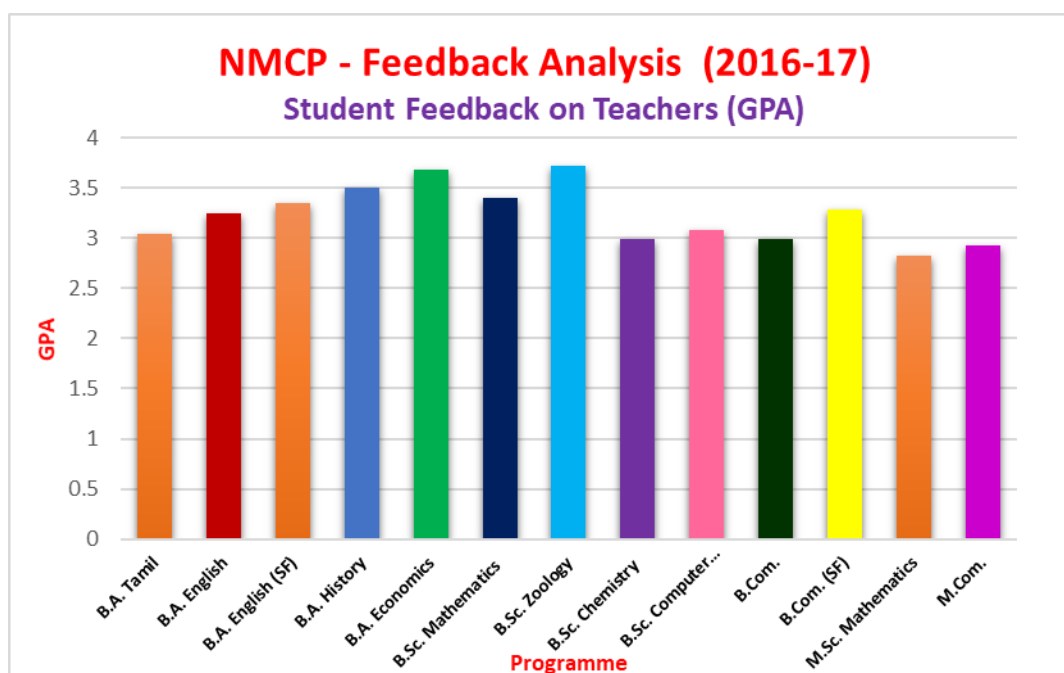

### **BEST PRACTICES**

#### **i) Awareness Programmes against Social Evils**

In this modern era where knowledge has exploded and scattered its information in every discipline, there is still an increasing gap in the realm of values and ethics. We firmly believe that knowledge and values go hand-in-hand to make an educated man. Since both complement each other, numerous value-based activities were instituted during this academic year. Our focus was on creating awareness among the student community regarding social evils like violence against girl child and women. Among them, women's safety was considered to be the need of the hour because many women students of our College would also be greatly and directly benefitted. Hence, Awareness Programmes and counselling on Women's Safety and Empowerment were frequently conducted. Another issue that stands severely condemned is ragging. We discourage ragging at all levels both within and outside the campus. So, in order to create a ragging-free atmosphere, a Programme on Anti-Ragging was undertaken by the College to impart the message that ragging of any kind would be seriously viewed and disciplinary action would be taken.

## **ii) Extension Programmes**

Numerous extension activities under the banner of NSS form another best practice in our Institution. Protecting the environment from anti-ecological elements, cleaning of plastic bags in the vicinity and removal of Karuvelam trees are some of the first-hand involvement on the part of our students. Further, a rally was held for instilling the spirit of National Integration. Echoing the social responsibility of the Government of India, Swachh Bharath Scheme was promoted by our volunteers. Poultry and Cattle Treatment Programme was also conducted. These steps undertaken by the College steer the students to become healthy educated citizens of our nation.

Awareness campaign regarding the recycling of waste products, reduced use of water, reduced usage of chemicals and pesticides, conservation of trees, planting of trees, recycling of organic plant products, keeping the surroundings clean, Plastic free and Pollution free environment were conducted in the nearby villages. So the students and the villagers were very much benefitted by this advocacy.
