## OUR COLLEGE

Nazareth Margoschis College at Pillaiyanmanai is a co-educational college of Arts, Science and Commerce. It is a Christian minority institution, named after the missionary Rev. Canon Arthur Margoschis. Situated in a rural area, the college has nearly 48 acres of land. It is easily accessible to the youth of the villages in the southern parts of Thoothukudi District. The college is under the management of Thoothukudi – Nazareth Diocesan Trust Association, the educational wing of the Thoothukudi – Nazareth Diocese of the Church of South India. The college was started in the year 1967 with three sections in the Pre-University Course affiliated to Madurai Kamaraj University. Since 1990, the college has been affiliated to Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli. The institution has completed 56 years of educational service to the youth of this rural area and celebrated its Golden Jubilee in the year 2017. The college was accredited by NAAC with B++ Grade (CGPA 2.93 out of 4.0) in the second cycle.

The college currently offers 10 Undergraduate and 5 Postgraduate courses. Departments of Commerce, Mathematics and English have been recognized as research centres by Manonmaniam Sundaranar University. The college has Chapel, Library, Auditorium, Conference Hall, Seminar

Hall, Laboratories, ICT enabled classrooms, Canteen, playground with standard 400 meters track and Gym facilities. Separate hostels for men and women are available in the campus.

As a Christian educational institution, the college offers best education with moral standards and good job prospects to cater to the educational needs of the rural learners. The college strives to impart comprehensive education and prepares the students to face the future challenges. Along with education, values and ethics are also taught to empower the students to become responsible citizens.

- ❖ Organised absence from classes and intimidation of students from attending classes are serious breaches of rules and regulations of the college which may lead to removal of the concerned student from the rolls of the college and his/her transfer certificate will be sent to the University during or at the end of the year.
- ❖ Students should go to their classes in time without disturbing other classes.
- ❖ Loitering and Lounging in the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- ❖ Attendance is taken every hour at the commencement of the class. Students who are not present at the beginning of the hour will be considered as absent to the respective class.

- ❖ Late comers should get permission from the Head of the Departments.
- ❖ Absence for one hour will be treated as absence for that session.
- ❖ Students are requested to spend their leisure hours in the library.
- ❖ Students should take care of college furniture and must not spoil or cause any deliberate damage or tamper with the college property, fitting, etc. Cost of repair will be recovered from the students causing damage.
- ❖ Smoking within the college or the premises of the residential halls and defacing the walls and such other offences will entail serious punishment.
- ❖ Use of drugs and alcoholic beverages of all kinds are strictly prohibited.
- ❖ Irregular attendance, insubordination to staff members, habitual inattention to class work, obscenity in word or action and such other conduct considered detrimental to the best interests of the college will be dealt severely.
- ❖ A highly decentralized department - wise examination system is followed.
- ❖ Every student should sit for two internal tests and one model exam.
- ❖ Copying in tests and examinations will be viewed very seriously and severe disciplinary action will be taken against those who indulge in such practice.

- ❖ Under the educational rules of the Government, the Principal has full power to inflict the following punishments (fine, cancellation of attendance, withholding of term certificate and suspension from the college).
- ❖ According to the instruction of the Director of Collegiate Education no.1947/R4/2000 dated 08-04-2000, students are not permitted to celebrate the bus farewell day.
- ❖ Vehicles should be parked only in the places allotted for them.
- ❖ Any kind of unruly behaviour, physical violence, harassment / teasing women and damage of the college property will be dealt very severely.
- ❖ Students are advised to see the notice board regularly for important announcements. Ignorance of any notice that is published will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with.
- ❖ Bus / train pass facilities are available for the welfare of the students and the students are encouraged to avail them.
- ❖ Students are not allowed to enter into the college garden.
- ❖ Students should give respect to their teachers when they meet them.
- ❖ Students should cooperate in making the campus plastic free and environment friendly.
- ❖ Publicity or sale of tobacco products or drugs and consumption of such items in college campus is strictly prohibited. If identified, strict disciplinary action will be taken.

- ❖ Students should maintain high standard of decency and decorum both within and outside the campus.
- ❖ Students are warned not to involve in ragging. Ragging is a serious offence.
- ❖ Students are not permitted to address any of the college authorities in organized group to bring pressure to bear on them. Such pressure group tactics are subversive of discipline and students who indulge in such kind of activities will be severely punished.
- ❖ Money or subscription of any kind should not be collected from the students for any reason without the knowledge and permission of the Principal and the Head of the Department concerned.
- ❖ Political or communal organisation of students should not be formed within the college or hostels.
- ❖ The college is under CCTV surveillance. Violation of the rules and regulation of the college will lead to serious penal action.

#### **Rules regarding Mobile Phone and Laptop usage**

Students are permitted to bring mobile phones and laptops to college

- ❖ Mobile phones and laptops can be used only for academic purposes during class hours
- ❖ Mobile phones should be in silent mode while on the college campus
- ❖ Students indulging in inappropriate use of mobile phones or laptops on campus will have to face disciplinary action taken by the college.

4. Students who are eligible to get scholarships are asked to apply for the scholarships at the proper time and get the benefits.



### **WOMEN STUDENTS**

- ❖ Women students should not leave the campus during class hours before 3.35 p.m. However, in case of emergency they shall do so after obtaining permission from the Principal through any one of the Students Welfare Officers or the Head of the Department.
- ❖ They should not stay in the retiring hall during class hours under the pretext of sickness. However, if a women student is indisposed, she should apply for leave and get it countersigned by the H.O.D.
- ❖ They are strictly not allowed to enter through the main entrance.

### **LEAVE AND ATTENDANCE**

- ❖ Students should not absent themselves from college without submitting leave application.
- ❖ Leave application of non-resident students should be countersigned by their parents or guardians and the resident students by the wardens and they must be submitted to the Mentor.
- ❖ Permission will not be granted to go out of their classes for the purpose of meeting friends or under any other pretext.
- ❖ Late comers will not be entertained.
- ❖ The certificate of attendance required for appearance in the University Examination will in no case be granted unless i) the Principal is satisfied with the student's progress and conduct, and ii) the student has the required attendance.

### **ATTENDANCE**

- ❖ Students who have 75% & above in the attendance are permitted to appear for the University Examinations without any pre-condition.
- ❖ Students who have an attendance between 60% and 74%, due to genuine reasons like health issues shall be permitted to appear for University examination by submitting the due medical certificate duly endorsed by the Principal.
- ❖ Students who have less than 60% of attendance must repeat the whole semester.

### **PAYMENT OF FEES**

- ❖ Students must remit their fees within 10 working days from the date of re-opening in each semester, failing which a fine at the rate of Rupee one per working day will be collected from the date of implementing fine.
- ❖ If a student fails to remit his/her fees with fine within the end of the month, his / her name will be removed from the rolls.
- ❖ Attendance will not be given to him/her for the defaulting days.
- ❖ If re-admitted, he / she must pay a re-admission fee in addition to the fees and fine due for him.
- ❖ Students are advised to retain the repayment receipts.

### **REVALUATION OF MARKS**

- ❖ There is provision for revaluation of examination papers conducted by the M.S. University.

### **SPOKEN ENGLISH COURSE**

- ❖ Spoken English class is conducted by the Department of English to enhance the communication skills of the students.

- ❖ No student shall re-lend the books taken from the library and books should be returned before the commencement of summer vacation.
- ❖ A borrowed book should be returned on the particular date, failing which a penalty of Rs. 2/- will be collected per day per book.
- ❖ Students are advised to return/renew the books on or before the due date marked on the book.
- ❖ Students who leave the college for any reason in the middle of the course, should return the books before they leave the college, for obtaining No Due Certificate from the librarian.

- ❖ The external examinations carry 75 marks and it will be of three hours duration.
- ❖ The M.S. University, Tirunelveli, conducts the external examinations at the end of each semester.
- ❖ A minimum of 40% is essential to get a pass mark.
